



Fra Angelico – Paul's Dispute before the Sanhedrin Cappella Niccolina, Palazzi Pontifici, Vatican












CLAUDIUS LYSIAS



TO HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR FELIX, GREETINGS.



Paul Taken to Caesarea




