What is LEADERSHIP?

Leadership is more than just showing up to events. Leadership is a commitment to be an *influencer*, and a commitment to *serve*.

John Maxwell, a famous leadership trainer, says, "Leadership is not about titles, positions or flowcharts. It is about one life *influencing* another."

There is this really great story in the Bible where two of Jesus' disciples, who were brothers, actually got their momma to ask for special leadership positions with Jesus for them. Could you imagine how oddly frustrating that would be for Jesus? After some back and forth, Jesus described leadership this way,

"But Jesus called them to him and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. It shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you *must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be your slave*, even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."
Matthew 20:25-28

The kind of leadership we're talking about is a little different than what the rest of the world might call leadership. We're looking for the kind of leadership Jesus was looking for. We're looking for the kind of leadership that is a beautiful combination of *servicing* and *influencing*.

We're not thinking of being *influencers* as our world is. It's not our job to make Jesus cool, or to promote ourselves as we lead. Rather we want to influence one another to love and follow Jesus in a deeper and more real way. That may mean we challenge each other or hold one another accountable, but in all we do we want to point each other and those we serve back towards Jesus.

The SLT exists to **BUILD INFLUENCERS** and to **SEND SERVANTS**.

Timeline and Makeup of the SLT

The SLT is a 12-month commitment. We will typically run from the end of the Summer (August) through to the end of the next summer. At that time, a new SLT will be formed. A member from one year CAN be a member in a following year. However, the position is not guaranteed, and the student will need to go through the application process each year.

The SLT will have a set number of open positions based on the size of the Student Ministry. Generally, we will be aiming for a 1:5 ratio, meaning if we have an average of 50 students, we will aim to have an SLT of 10 students for that school year. The number of positions open can vary based on student ministry size and at the discretion of the Youth Pastor.

There is not an expectation of x number of boys or x number of high school students in the SLT. Any student that meets the qualifications will be reviewed and it is our hope that each student will consider the SLT as an opportunity to both grow and to contribute.

Qualifications of the SLT

Every member of the SLT must meet and maintain certain qualifications. Only those individuals that meet the following qualifications will be considered. The applicant must:

- be entering 11th - 12th grade
- have a growing relationship with Jesus
- be connected with other followers of Jesus
- have a positive reputation

Expectations of the SLT

It is our desire to “let you know what you’re getting into,” so to speak. So, we want to be completely up front with what will be expected from each member of the SLT. Please take these expectations seriously...because we do.

Each member of the SLT will be expected to:

- **Influence** others through **Serving** (i.e., lead)
- attend a monthly, non-negotiable, SLT meeting (entire team together)
- participate in a rotating weekly serve team (smaller teams within the SLT that rotate weekly)
- maintain a strong attendance at Small Groups and on Sunday Mornings
- provide critical feedback to leadership regarding the Student Ministry (i.e., if there is a problem, speak up)
- remain in good standing with the SLT for the full 12-month commitment

Commitments of an SLT member

If the above are firm expectations we use to measure success within the SLT, then the following is a list of commitments we are asking each member to choose and to be stretched by. Remember, we said at the beginning that leadership was a commitment more than an inherent character trait. Therefore, leadership is less about who you are and more about who you are becoming.

Each member of the SLT is committed to:

- GROWING to be more like Jesus
- DISCOVERING his/her ministry and giftedness
- CONNECTING with other followers of Jesus in meaningful relationships
- REACHING unbelieving friends with the hope found in Jesus
- HONORING God with his/her choices and attitude
- SPEAKING up fearlessly when silence is easier
- STICKING it out even when it gets hard

You made it this far! Congrats! The next step for you is to stop what you're doing...stop checking off the steps. Take a breath. This page isn't just a hoop to jump through. ***I want you to prayerfully consider the Student Leadership Team.***

Ask God if this is what He wants you to do. Being on the SLT doesn't make me or God like you more. You won't get a larger inheritance from your parents because you signed up. You're awesome whether you're on the team or not.

Actually, I expect many students to discover this isn't the right time to apply... and that's perfectly fine. It's OK if you put this application down for a few days as you wait on God's direction. And it's OK if after doing so you realize now is not the time and you come back to it next year. Don't rush it and don't force it.

Really! This paper won't self-destruct while you pray. If it does, let me know. It'll make a great story. And it may be a sign we need to consider this application more closely.

Well OK then. Welcome back to the application. Here is how the application process works.

Step 1: The application. You will need to complete the application on the next page and turn it in to the Student Pastor.

Step 2: The references. I know you're awesome. You know you're awesome. But I'm not going to take just YOUR word on it. You need to get three (3) references: one from a parent/guardian, one from another adult who knows you (could be a family member, coach, teacher, etc), and one from your small group leader. It is YOUR job to get them their reference letters, which they will then complete and send to me. Write your name in the space provided and let your reference take care of the rest of the work.

Step 3: The review. This is the hardest part for you because it means waiting on your end. On our end, a team of adult leaders in the student ministry will review all applications and references received. There may even be some interviews along the way. We'll let you know as soon as we can.
