
The Glory of Christ, Part 1

Col 1:15-17



Background: What do chiastic poetic structures, the Early Church, and a middle-aged Italian plumber in a land of sentient mushrooms have in common? They all point to the ultimate reality of the Lord Jesus Christ! Sermon Text: Col 1:15-17 (ESV)

 $\underline{15}$ He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. $\underline{16}$ For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. $\underline{17}$ And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together.
