Background

When Fred Rogers of "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood" fame accepted a lifetime achievement award in 1997, he used his time in the spotlight to redirect it onto the people in his life and in the lives of everyone in attendance who helped them become who they are. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, <u>47</u> praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people.
